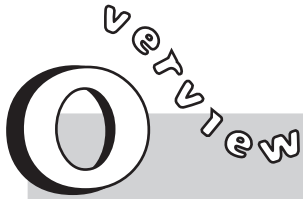




House Riddle Pictures



Students create riddle pictures or books based on the book *A House is a House for Me*.

Preparing

- Remind students that *A House is a House for Me* suggests you can think of almost anything as a house for some other thing.

Doing

- Ask the students to look around the room and see if they can find some things that are “houses” for other things (e.g., a pencil sharpener is a house for pencil shavings). They can also think of ideas from the book and other places. When they do they should use the phrase:

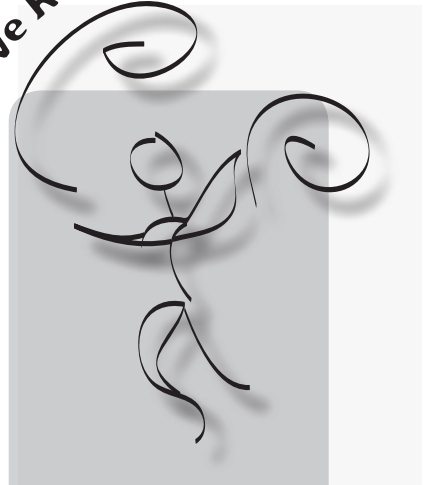
A _____ is a house for a _____.

- Record ideas on the board or large paper for later reference.
- Invite students to choose a favorite idea for a riddle picture (for small books, they will need as many ideas as there are pages in the book). Explain that they will draw a picture of their “house.” Below the picture, they write, “What is a _____ a house for?” They record the answer on a folded flap at the bottom of the page or on the back.
- Distribute paper and drawing supplies and begin
